

## Tutorial «Miss Coco» © par PUCA®

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## Material:

- 12 Amos® par Puca®
- 12 Piros® par Puca®
- 1 « Jeff » wooden base par Puca®
- 5gr Delicas 11/0 (DB11)
- 1 tassel 10mm thickness
- 1 x 14 mm head bead
- 1 x 2 mm metal bead
- Seed beads 15/0 (R15)
- 2 x 10 mm Flower caps
- 1 x 5mm ø ring
- 1 clasp
- 1 x 3cm eye pin
- Fireline 0.12
- Glue



1) Pick up 48 DB11 and close. Place your work on the middle of thread, we're going to work with 2 threads



2) Place your work on the 3) Bead a total of 7 rows. wooden base and work with Peyote



Work with 2 threads to balance your work



4) Bead 4 R15 rows on each side



5) Pick up 1 R15, pass through 3 R15 like picture. Repeat for the length of the pattern and for both sides



6) Pick up 1 R15, 1 Piros, 1 R15 between each central R15. Repeat for the length of the pattern



7) Pick up 1 R15 between each R15, repeat for the length of the pattern



8) You'll now have this



9) Exit through top hole of Piros and place 1 DB11 between each Piros



10) You'll now have this



11) Turn work over and exit though central R15



12) Pick up 1 R15, 1 Amos, 1 R15 between each central R15



13) You'll now have this Exit through R15 like picture



14) Pick up 1 R15 between each R15. Repeat for the length of the pattern



15) You'll now have this Close your work



16) We're going to assemble all elements



17) Place your eye pin on the tassel like picture



18) Put some glue on the top of the tassel and place your wooden base



19) Place a flower cap on the eye pin



20) Place one head bead, 1 flower cap and 1 metal bead. Make a loop with your eye pin



21) Place your Miss Coco on a clasp, with one ring, to make a charm's or a pendant!



22) Congratulations! You have finished your Miss!
